

Missy Trull becomes Bossey Ecumenical Institute student for autumn semester

We are pleased that Missy Trull will be enrolled at the Ecumenical Institute of Bossey, Switzerland in the autumn quarter to earn her Complimentary Certificate in Ecumenical Studies, a three month course.

At the conclusion of her course work she will receive a diploma and 30 course credits jointly awarded by ecumenical Institute and the Autonomous Faculty of Protestant Theology of the University of Geneva.

Missy grew up in Spokane, WA. After course work in literature and creative writing at Seattle Pacific University her quest led her to continue studies at the School of Theology and Ministry.

For six years she attended and served as Lay Pastor for Children Formation at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in downtown Seattle. She has been a chaplain at Harborview Medical Center.

Missy is the second STM student to travel for ecumenical study at Bossey. Linda Gasparovic was the first Bossey student in 2013. She is of the United Church of Christ tradition.

The Bossey Scholarship was the vision of Loren Arnett. His commitment to ecumenical scholarship and justice is part of the Loren Arnett Endowed Scholarship at the School of Theology and Ministry at Seattle University.
